A note from the Nurse - High School Dental Health: Protecting Smiles That Last a Lifetime
Busy schedules, sports, part-time jobs, and social activities can make it easy for teens to overlook dental care—but healthy habits now prevent bigger (and more expensive) problems later.
Why It Matters: Tooth decay and gum disease can cause pain, missed school days, difficulty concentrating, and even impact confidence. According to the American Dental Association, maintaining strong oral health during the teen years is critical for long-term dental wellness.

Tips for Teens:

- Brush twice daily for 2 minutes with fluoride toothpaste.
- Floss once a day—yes, it still matters!
- Limit energy drinks, soda, and frequent snacking on sugary or acidic foods.
- Wear a mouthguard during sports.
- Keep up with dental check-ups every 6 months.
- If your teen has braces or aligners, follow cleaning instructions carefully.

Wisdom teeth often emerge during the high school years, so regular dental visits are especially important. If your teen reports tooth pain, jaw discomfort, bleeding gums, or sensitivity, please schedule a dental appointment. Healthy smiles support healthy confidence—let's help our teens build habits that last a lifetime!
