**A note from the Nurse -** Stress Awareness & Healthy Coping for High School Students  
High school can be exciting—but it can also be stressful. Between classes, activities, friendships, and future plans, it's normal to feel overwhelmed at times. Stress is your body's natural response to challenges, but too much of it can affect your mood, sleep, and overall health.

Know the signs of stress:

- Trouble sleeping or constant fatigue
- Headaches or stomachaches
- Feeling anxious, irritable, or unmotivated
- Difficulty concentrating

Healthy ways to manage stress:

- Stay organized: Use a planner to keep track of assignments and deadlines
- Take breaks: Short breaks while studying can improve focus and reduce burnout
- Get moving: Physical activity—even a short walk—can boost mood and relieve tension
- Talk it out: Share your feelings with a trusted friend, family member, or school staff
- Practice relaxation: Try deep breathing, stretching, or mindfulness techniques

Remember, you don't have to handle stress alone. If you're feeling overwhelmed, reach out to the school nurse or counselor—we're here to support you. Taking care of your mental health is just as important as taking care of your physical health. - Alisa Pond
